The planning meeting was well attended and the programs gals have many events scheduled for this year. The fair was a big success and thank you to all who helped with the quilts, knitting and sewing. Many lovely entries in all of the different categories. The drawing for our raffle quilt took place at the fair and Midge Reed was the winner. signed out for home use intervals of two weeks. The new machine would be available at meetings and on sew days. All of our current dies (listed on website) are usable on an electric machine. It would be helpful if you went to the accuquilt.com website and watched the demo. We of course will vote on this purchase and proceed according to the wishes of the members.

Deborah has our last years purchase of the printer for fabric pictures, labels etc. If you had graduation, weddings etc. during the summer months let her know what you need printed. She has done some beautiful work with that machine.

The guild has some new members signing up to fill the spots of those who no longer will be attending our meetings. Remember that

we have capped our membership at 80 due to workable space and safety. There will be a waiting list so encourage your quilting friends to get on the list if they are interested in becoming a member.

I look forward to the start of a new year with the guild and seeing all of you that I did not see over the summer months. All suggestions and comments are welcome but please contact me prior to meeting if it is going to be something I need to do a bit of research on.

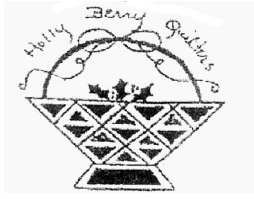

RECIPE CORNER

Moroccan Raw Carrot Salad

- 2 lb. carrots, peeled and shredded
- 3 tbsp. chopped flat leaf Parsley

Dressing

- 1/4 cup Extra Virgin Olive Oil
- 1/3 cup fresh lemon juice
- 2 garlic cloves, finely chopped
- 1 tsp. salt
- 1 tsp. ground cumin
- 1/8 tsp cayenne pepper
- Parsley sprigs for garnish

Directions

You may shred carrots in food processor or purchase already shredded. Add carrots and parsley to a large bowl.

Make Dressing—whisk lemon juices & spices.

Keep whisking while slowly adding the olive oil to emulsify the ingredients.

Toss the dressing with shredded carrots and parsley, chill for an hour to let flavors merge.

Note: This salad can be stored in an airtight container in the fridge for several days.

Our wonderful Holiday Luncheon! The luncheon is catered. Please read the Hospitality information in the newsletter. Please remember your Secret Sister.



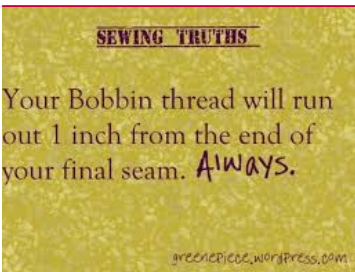
Membership
