

## Recipe Corner

### Day Before Mashed Potatoes

2 1/2 lb. potatoes peeled, quartered and cooked  
1 (3 oz) pkg. Cream Cheese  
1/2 cup sour cream  
2 tbsp. butter, or to taste  
1/2 tsp. onion powder (or garlic)  
Salt and pepper to taste

In a large bowl, mash or whip the potatoes. Add the cream cheese, sour cream, butter, onion powder, salt and pepper and mix until smooth (add a little milk if necessary). Transfer to a greased 1-1/2 qt baking dish. Bake now or refrigerate and bake next day. Bake uncovered at 350 degrees F for 30 minutes or until heated through.


